At the last meeting there were issues with the Zoom meeting presentation. Alto has outsourced their network to an outside contracting firm. This was a major issue for Alto as the building lost phone, electronic services, employee pagers and internet service. 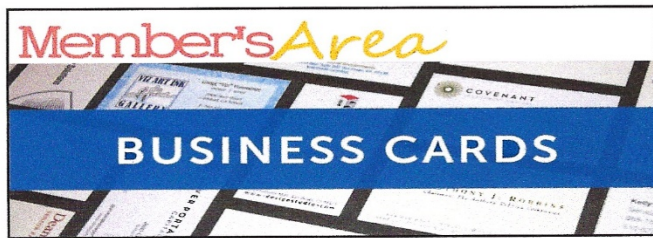

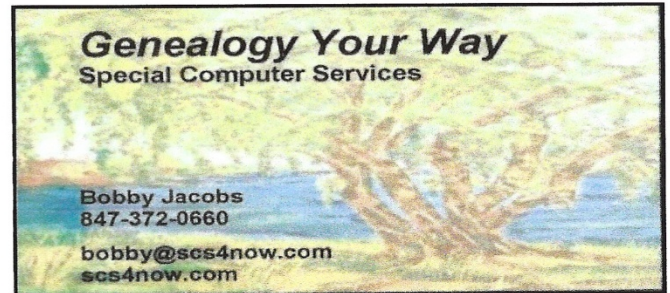
