

Fast, easy teleconferencing

Teleconferencing is great for meeting with people over the internet. You can talk to friends, relatives, or business associates, and look them right in the eye while doing so. Jitsi is one of several services that enable you to make those connections.

Jitsi is a free teleconferencing service that can be used on a computer, tablet, or smart phone that are equipped with a browser. I doubt that there are any of those devices that are *not* so equipped! Here are some of its important features:

- Jitsi is FREE!
- It is open source.
- It starts up much faster than Zoom.
- Familiar Zoom-like look and feel.
- Requires no installation of extra software.
- No 40 minute timeout, like the free version of Zoom.

To start a Jitsi meeting, go to <https://meet.jit.si>. At the browser screen, click the “Start meeting” button. The next screen is where you can click “Join meeting”, or click one of the 5 buttons below the Join button. Of those 5, the middle button shows you invitation options for inviting others to your meeting. When selected, a small window pops up that gives you several options for sending the invite(s) to a prospective attendee(s).

One of the fun options is that you can create your own imaginative pass phrases that uniquely identify your meeting.

Here's one I typed: Comon Joe - Lets meet at 3 pm

This is displayed on my Jitsi screen: Comon Joe Letsmeetat 3 pm

Notice how it deals with spaces and dashes. There are some characters that are not allowed. You will be informed of those in red letters while you are composing.

I have used it for several meetings, mostly computer club related, and I find it very easy to work with.






